Dealing with Hunger, Malnutrition and Eradicating Poverty-

The population of Christian Community in India is about 2.3% (Census 2011). There are few states where good number of Christian populations fall below Poverty line. The rural and remote areas of states like Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Odisha and Bihar have a large number of such Christian people around. The material basis of survival includes livelihood, Housing and Health.

The hunger, malnutrition and poverty are the outcome of large disparities in income slabs but also due to discrimination in income opportunities etc. The people of Christian Community in India living in rural and remote areas have to fight hard to come out from the situation for which they have to move to Megapolis/ Metropolitan Cities in the search of food, good living and better health prospects, eg. Girls working as House maids in Megapolis/Metropolitan Cities where they get complimentary food, shelter and health facilities along with their salary.

The Christian people of urban areas are generations of educated Christian people who migrated to cities after independence for better life. The goal of this paper is to focus on issues of Christian Community with regard to the hunger, malnutrition and poverty and to assess; as to how the understanding, knowledge and implementation of the Government Schemes can help these to be dealt with firmly.
